Gospel Story ●

JOHN 12:27-36

It was a few days before the very
important feast of Passover, and
Jesus was speaking to his friends,
Philip and Andrew. He told them that
he was troubled all the way down to
his soul! But, Jesus knew it was not
the time to ask his Father, God for
peace, but to ask him to speak! God
said for all to hear, "I have glorified
My name. And again I will bring glory!"
Some people in the crowd thought
they had heard thunder! Other's
thought it was an angel. But Jesus
showed told the the truth - soon the
spiritual battle for God's people
would begin. Jesus tells them that he
will cast out the ruler of the world
(that's Satan) when he is lifted up (on
the cross). The people did not
understand what Jesus meant. They
did not understand who Jesus was.
So, he warned them that they would
have (his) light for only a little longer,
and they need to follow that light
while they can. Darkness is so
powerful, scary, and confusing
without light. If they follow and
believe in the light, then they will
become sons and daughters of the
light!

Gospel Story ●

JOHN 12:1-11

Six days before the very important
feast of Passover, Jesus visited his
friends Lazarus (yes, the one he
raised from the dead!), Mary, and
Martha. While Martha served dinner,
Mary brought out very expensive
perfume. Someone would have to
work from sunup to sundown to buy
this perfume! What do you think she
did with it? She put it on Jesus' feet!
Not only that, but then she dried off
his feet with her own hair! Why do
you think she did that? As confused
as you might be, there was someone
else in the room who was confused
and *angry*. His name was Judas. Jesus
knew Judas very well; he knew that
Judas' heart did not match his words.
Judas said, "Why do you have such an
expensive thing when all of the
money its worth could go to the
poor?" That sounds like a good
question, but Judas was in charge of
the money they gave to the poor, and
Judas liked to keep some of that
money for himself. Jesus said, "Leave
her alone. Let her keep [the perfume]
for when I die and am buried. The
poor will always be here, but I will
not." Jesus knew that Judas was the
one who would betray him and lead
to his death.

LUKE 22:1-6

The important celebration of
Passover was almost here, and the
priests and leaders were scared.
They were scared because huge
crowds were coming to Jerusalem
and many of them believed that Jesus
was actually the Son of God! They
were more scared of a group of
worshippers than the One True God
they claimed to serve. They were
searching for a way to kill this Jesus.
Satan also knew the time was near
to get rid of Jesus once and for all (or so
he thought). Satan tempted Judas
(remember him?) to go to the priests
and leaders seeking money in
exchange for Jesus. They agreed to
give him a month's worth of pay for
the opportunity to arrest Jesus. Now,
Judas had to figure out how to get
Jesus away from the crowds, because
he too had lost his view of God and
was more scared of the angry mob
that would rise up if Jesus was
harmled.

Gospel Story ●

LUKE 22:14-23

Finally it was Passover - the day God's people remembered when He rescued them from slavery in Egypt. All of the food at the Passover meal - all of it reminded them of how severely they were treated by Egypt and how miraculously they were saved, or *passed over* during the judgement of Egypt. Jesus had been looking forward to this feast with his disciples for a long time, because this was the time to give new meaning to the meal. By the next year, the disciples would remember Jesus at Passover, not just their cultural history. The wine would remind them of the blood Jesus spilled, becoming himself the Passover lamb to cover the sins of the world. The bread would represent his body, sent to the world for the sole purpose of dying for the brothers and sisters of light. He took the Old Promise of deliverance and made it New - he would pour himself out so that all nations could be saved through belief in him. Even in this holy, eternity-changing moment, there was still one at the table who did not believe, and would soon betray our Savior. But don't worry, Jesus knew exactly what was going to happen. He was ready.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS ●

1 **Jesus is condemned to death** - The governor, Pilate was able to release one prisoner every year. The priests and leaders did not want Jesus released, so they convinced the crowd to demand that the violent criminal, Barabbas be released instead. Pilate asked the crowd what he should do with Jesus and they responded, "Crucify him!"



- Pray silently -

2. **Jesus takes up His cross** - So Pilate washed his hands to say that he would not be held accountable for Jesus' death. The crowd responded, "His blood will be on us and our children forever!" Pilate was released while Jesus was whipped and handed over to the Romans to die on the cross.

- Pray silently. -

3. **Jesus falls for the first time** - "So he was despised and forsaken by men, this man of suffering, grief's patient friend. As if he was a person to avoid, we looked the other

way; he was despised, forsaken, and we took no notice of him." (ISAIAH 53:3 The Voice)

- Pray silently. -

4. **Jesus meets His mother** - Simeon prophesies to Mary after Jesus is dedicated in the temple as a baby - "Listen, this child will make many in Israel rise and fall. He will be a significant person whom many will oppose. In the end, He will lay bare the secret thoughts of many hearts. And a sword will pierce even your own soul, Mary." (LUKE 2:34b-35 The Voice)

- Pray silently -

5. **Simon helps Jesus to carry the cross** - Jesus was so hurt and tired that he struggled to drag the cross to Golgotha, so the Roman soldiers with Jesus grabbed a man on the road named Simon of Cyrene to carry the cross for Jesus.

- Pray silently. -

6. **Veronica wipes the face of Jesus** - Though it is not recorded in scripture there is a hope that someone on the

road comforted Jesus in his pain, wiping away the blood and sweat from his face. Traditionally this hope is named Veronica. We envision this as we read Matthew 5:7, "Blessed are the merciful - for they will be shown mercy."

- Pray silently. -

7. **Jesus falls for the second time -**

"My heart seizes within my chest; I am in anguish! I am terrified my life could end on any breath. I shiver and shudder in fear; I cannot stop because this horror is just too much." (PSALM 55:4-5 The Voice)

- Pray silently. -

8. **Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem -**

In the crowd following Jesus to Golgotha, there were many women screaming and crying in grief. Jesus spoke to them saying, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for Me. Weep instead for yourselves

and weep for your children." He prophesies, again, the imminent and utter destruction of Jerusalem.

- Pray silently. -

9. **Jesus falls for the third time -**

"But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed." (ISAIAH 53:5 ESV)

- Pray silently. -

10. **Jesus is stripped of His clothes**

- The Roman soldiers made fun of Jesus, hitting and spitting at him. They tore the clothes off of him and wrestled a purple robe over his wounded body. They shoved a crown made out of thorns on his tender head. They mocked his heavenly kingship in a twisted game of dress up. Again, they ripped the clothes off of his body and led him away to die.

- Pray silently. -

11. **Jesus is nailed to the cross** - The journey to Golgotha, which means

Place of a Skull, was long and humiliating. When they finally arrived, Jesus' wrists and feet were nailed to the wood of the cross. The cross was then lifted upright and set between two criminals also assigned to die on that day. A sign with Jesus' crimes are posted above his head. It reads, "This is Jesus, the King of the Jews."

- Pray silently. -

12. **Jesus dies on the cross -**

Darkness covered the land in the middle of the day. Jesus cries out, "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?" A little while later, Jesus speaks again. He says, "Father, into Your hands I give over my spirit." Then, Jesus breathed his last breath. Suddenly, the earth shook so violently that rocks split, heavy tombs were opened, the curtain in the temple was torn, and many saints were raised from the dead, appearing to many in Jerusalem. The soldier in charge who witnessed all of this said,

There was a Jewish leader named Joseph, from Arimathea. Even though he was part of the council that condemned Jesus, he was good and righteous, and did not agree with the plan to kill Jesus. So that the body of Jesus would not be further humiliated on the cross, Joseph asked Pilate's permission to bury Jesus. This was a very brave thing to do, because Joseph was acting as a family member. He not only associated himself with Jesus, but treated him as a beloved relation. You see, Joseph was in a unique position to help, because he had an unused burial tomb to offer up. Pilate allowed for Jesus' body to be released, wrapped and placed in the tomb. Because the Sabbath would begin soon, the women who had followed Jesus in the crowd hurriedly prepared Jesus' body for burial with spices and ointments. Then they rested from their work on the Sabbath as God commanded.

Beneath the Cross of Jesus

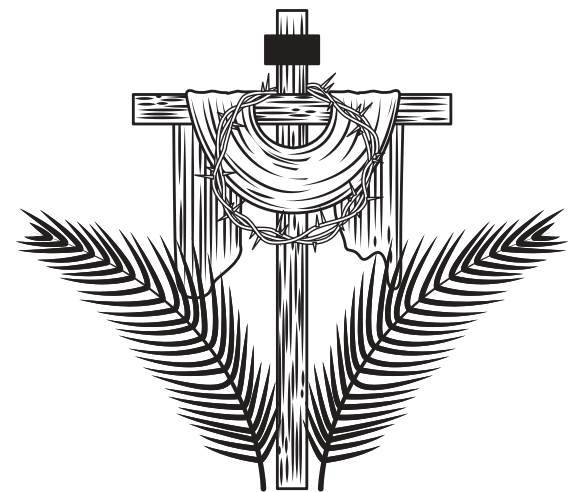

Holy Monday

Follow the Light - Use tape or string to make a path. Darken the room and have your family try to follow the path. Then, let everyone follow a leader who has a flashlight or candle. If possible, follow the path one more time giving everyone a light.

When Jesus lived on earth, he showed us how to live and how to love God. Without his light we are lost. But we didn't lose the light when he died, because he gave each of us who believe the Holy Spirit. We are sons and daughters of light!

Holy Tuesday

Foot Washing - Grab a chair, a large bowl, a pitcher of water, a towel, and scented lotion or perfume. Have the spiritual leader wash each person's feet, praying he or she washes and anoints them.

Mary washed Jesus' feet with expensive perfume and her hair because she knew he was her King. Later, we will hear that Jesus stoops down to wash the feet of his disciples! This is because in Jesus' Kingdom, the leader always serves his people and the people love their King.

Holy Wednesday

The Unfair Store - Select a few items to sell at your "store". Use sticky notes to price these items with crazy prices. Once your children realize that this store doesn't make any sense, ask them how much they would pay for a person they know. How much would they pay for the Savior of the World?

In reality, Judas received the equivalent of a month's pay in exchange for the life of Jesus. While no amount of riches would ever compare to the King of the Universe, it does show us how foolish Judas' idol of money was compared to that of the Son of the One True God.

Activities for a Meaningful Holy Week

Strip the Holy

Space - Traditionally, Maundy Thursday is the day when the altar is stripped in preparation for Good Friday. All the linens, candles, and anything other decorative items are removed. Usually a cross is left and draped with a black veil. Recreate this in your home by stripping whatever room or area you have been using for worship. Put away all pictures, pillows, books, everything. If you can, leave a cross in the room covered in black or dark fabric. Spend a few moments in the empty room in silence, contemplating the weight of tomorrow.

Maundy Thursday

Stations of the Cross - Use the Stations of the Cross script with the following stations. You can either place the stations on a table to follow, cut them apart and tape them around the house to walk to each station, or use the blank sheet to allow the participants to draw their own scenes as they listen to the readings.

Good Friday

Make a Tomb -

If you are able, make Easter Rolls by rolling a marshmallow in crescent roll dough. Once it is baked, a hollow space (tomb) will be left but the marshmallow will be gone. Or... Take the cross that you covered in yesterday's activity and place it in a "tomb". This could be a cabinet, a drawer, or a box. Leave the cross there until Easter Sunday. Celebrate the message of the cross on Easter by decorating your worship space with artwork and party decorations.
